How does a whole home generator work?

Generators, can run on liquid propane (LP) or use your homes natural gas lines. Like your AC unit, they are located outside of your home. When the power in your home unexpectedly goes out, a standby generator detects a problem, waits for a signal to verify an outage, and automatically turns on. In just a couple minutes your electricity, internet and appliances will be restored!

Tips for Avoiding Spring Backups

As spring arrives and heavy rainstorms roll in, the plumbing system in your home may be affected and you could be dealing with an unpleasant backup. Here are four tips for protecting your home from this messy and unpleasant situation:



INSTALL A BACKWATER VALVE

If the city's sewage system becomes overwhelmed, it can back up into your house. Not only will you have to deal with your own home's sewage, but your neighbor's as well. consider installing a backwater valve to keep the flow out of your house.



CHECK YOUR SUMP PUMP

When water builds up around your property, it must go somewhere and that somewhere shouldn't be inside your house. The sump pump discharge should terminate in the yard and does not get directly tied into the citys storm or sewer system. Be sure this important piece of equipment is always working with annual maintenance.



INSTALL A BACKUP SUMP PUMP

If a storm knocks out power for an extended period, it could lead to overflow as your sump pump remains incapacitated. Backup systems use batteries. By the way, if you have a whole home generator, this won't happen!



REPLACE OLD BURIED PIPING

If your buried sewage pipe is old, you could be at risk for cracks or breakage from shifting earth. Spring melts cause movements that can affect your underground pipes, so before this happens, have an Oliver plumber inspect and replace any at-risk piping.




















Enjoy This Spring Time Recipe!

Barbecue Chicken Salad

Barbecue Chicken Salad is every bit as tasty as it sounds. It's healthy-ish and filling at the same time!



Ingredients

FOR THE CHICKEN
1 1/2 cups of your favorite barbecue sauce
1/4 cup apricot preserves
1 garlic clove
6 skin-on, bone-in chicken breasts
1 tbsp. salt

FOR THE SALAD

1 tbsp. salted butter

12 oz. (2 cups) frozen corn

1 15-ounce can black beans, drained and rinsed
Juice of 1 lime

3 romaine lettuce hearts, chopped

1 cup fresh cilantro leaves

1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved

1 avocado, chopped

3/4 cup of your favorite ranch dressing

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. For the chicken: Pour the barbecue sauce into a medium saucepan, then add the apricot preserves and grate in the garlic. Heat the mixture over medium heat until piping hot. Remove 1/3 cup sauce to a bowl and set aside for when the chicken is done.
- Line a baking sheet with foil and add the chicken breasts skin-side up. Brush 1 tablespoon of sauce over each breast, then sprinkle each with 1/2 teaspoon salt.
- Roast the chicken in the oven for about 35 minutes, brushing each breast with about 1 tablespoon of sauce a couple of times. When the chicken is done, a thermometer inserted into the center will reach 165 degrees. Brush the chicken with the reserved sauce; let cool.
- 4. For the salad: Melt the butter in a large skillet over mediumhigh heat. Stir in the corn and cook until heated through, 5 minutes. Add the black beans and lime juice and cook until hot, 2 minutes.
- Slice the chicken off the bone. Toss the lettuce, cilantro, tomatoes, avocado and corn-bean mixture in a large bowl; toss with the ranch dressing. Divide the salad among bowls and top with the chicken.

May is Electrical Safety Month




Make sure your home is electrically safe, secure and efficient with Home Electrical Safety Devices. Oliver certified electricians can add, replace or install these safety devices.
